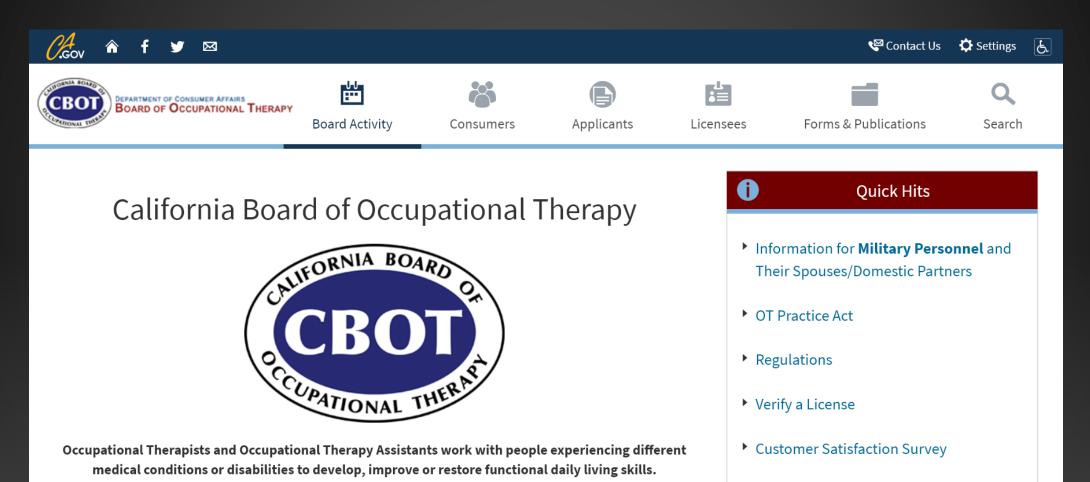

ENFORCEMENT QUESTIONS?

REGULATION: KEY QUESTIONS IN 2024

- Should there be a limit on the number of people an OT supervises? (1OT:3OTAs -> 1OT:?Students?)
- 2. Should 24 PDUs include ethics education and DEI?
- **3.** Are Advanced Practice requirements appropriate for current graduates of ACOTE-accredited programs?
- 4. What can CBOT do to support disaster management?
- 5. What qualifications do people need to have to serve on CBOT committees?
- 6. Are CBOT's fees adequate to support CBOT's mandate?

LEGISLATION: CALIFORNIA BILLS REVIEWED IN 2024

- AB 2725 (Rubio and Muratsuchi), Teacher credentialing: occupational and physical therapists.
- AB 1991 (Bonta), Data that Boards must collect on licensees and registrants (National Provider Identifier number).
- AB 2269 (Flora), Board membership qualifications: public members.
- AB 2442 (Zbur), AB 2862 (Gipson), and SB1067 (Smallwood-Cuevas): Expedited licensure process for gender-affirming health care and gender-affirming mental health care, medically underserved areas or populations, and African American applicants.
- AB 2753 (Ortega), Rehabilitative and habilitative services: durable medical equipment, financial or treatment limitations (including annual caps or requirements limiting coverage of the devices to those for home use.)
- AB 3127 (McKinnor), Reporting of crimes: mandated reporters (when to report domestic abuse to law enforcement/criminal-justice system, when to social services/advocates).

THE VALUE OF OCCUPATIONAL LICENSING

In addition to protecting the consumer (and profession) from malpractice and bad actors, licensing has been found to:

- Promote Opportunity
- Reduce racial wage gap among men by 43%
- Reduce gender wage gap between women and white men by 36%-40%

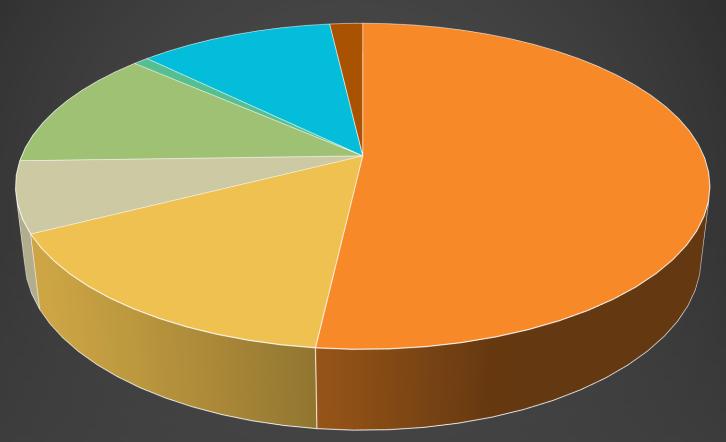

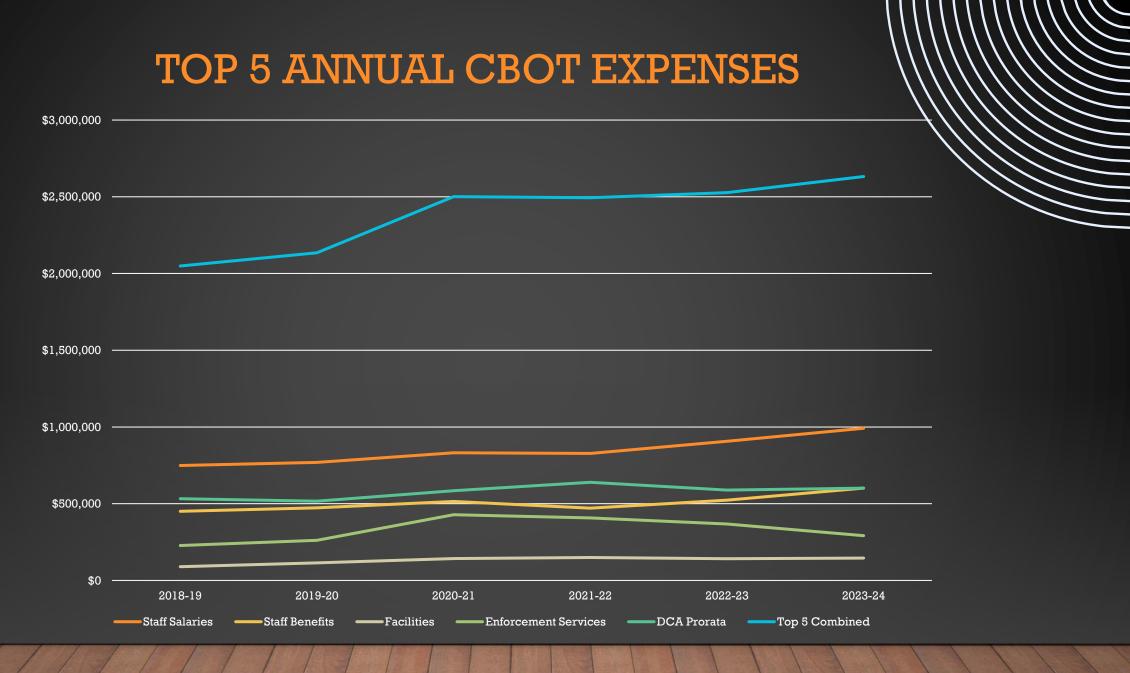

FEE DISCUSSIONS BY CBOT

- 2021: Projected CBOT budget deficit in January 2024. Need for fee increase. Referred to ad hoc subcommittee for fee review.
- 8/19/2022: New fee schedule approved by Board. Required legislation and possible formal fee analysis (\$50,000 price tag).
- 11/3/2023: Fee Analysis legislation stalled in 2023, and CBOT financial projections improved. Board decides to reconsider new fee schedule.
- 2/8/2024: Revised fee schedule (lower and later than before) approved by Board vote.
- 10/29/2024: Fee Analysis bid received by CBOT.

The Board is currently recruiting qualified occupational therapists to review case materials, prepare written opinions, and possibly testify at administrative hearings as a Practice Reviewer. Practice Reviewers are paid \$75 per hour for case review and preparation of the expert opinion report and \$120 per hour plus expenses if called to testify at an administrative hearing. If you wish to provide this service to your community, please verify that you have:

> Ten or more years of experience with seven years of recent experience in the area of expertise for which they are reviewing cases or rendering a professional opinion.

Advanced Practice Reviewers

The Board is currently recruiting qualified occupational therapists review applicants for advanced practice approval and applications for advanced practice post-professional education. Advanced Practice Reviewers are paid \$75 per hour for their services. If you wish to provide this service to your community, please verify that you have:

> At least five, of the past seven years, practicing in an advanced practice area.

Both Practice Reviewers and Advanced Practice Reviewers must have:

- > A current and active California OT license without restrictions.
- > No prior or current charges or discipline against any health care related license in California or in any other place of licensure.
- > No criminal convictions, including any that were expunged or dismissed.

If you meet the requirements and are interested in providing this service to your community, complete the <u>Practice Reviewer application</u> or <u>Advanced Practice Reviewer</u> <u>application</u> and follow the instructions carefully.
